


he Missoula based Adventure Cycling Association was established in 1973 to cater to a growing number of American touring cyclists. The nonprofit organization publishes a magazine, produces long distance touring maps, and runs group tours for its 40,000+ members, world wide. ACA members have frequently included the Adventure Cycling Missoula office in their tour itineraries. Fascinated by this marvelous parade of visitors, Adventure Cycling Art Director Greg Siple began making black and white portraits of them and their bikes in the summer of 1982. Now nearly 3,000 portraits later, Siple has taken these riders and bikes back on the road in a 2-year, grand tour of Montana. Men and women, old and young, strait-laced and bizarre, tragic and triumphant - a bit of Everyman is represented in Siple's photographs. The tour is under the auspices of the Museum and Art Gallery Directors Association of Montana (MAGDA of Montana).

# NATURE & SPIRIT: FRANK TETRAULT May 22 through June 29

Members Reception May 29, 5 to 7 p.m.

eet artist **Frank Tetrault** and enjoy a closer look at his inspired creations in wood. Tetrault spent 32 months sculpting relief carvings of the Twelve Apostles; the carvings were later commissioned as bronze works for the Methodist Hospital System. Tetrault prefers linden wood for most of his works, sculpting each piece first in clay. The artist explains that this gives him an opportunity to make changes. With wood, "You cut the piece of wood away and it is gone."

When Tetrault became serious about wood carving and learning sculpture concepts, he visited national wood carving schools in Germany and Switzerland. Further training came when he worked with Bavarian master carver, Ludwig Klieninger. Over the years, Tetrault has carved his own master works of animals, including birds and a 4-foot tall, standing grizzly bear.

## RAILS, TRAILS, AND A ROAD

## An Exhibition Celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the Going-to-the-Sun Road June 26—October 18, 2008

The Hockaday Museum has developed a major exhibition to celebrate momentous Going-to-the Sun Road on the occasion of its 75th Anniversary. Rails, Trails and a Road features historic photographs and video footage of the building of the Sun Road; paintings by acclaimed Glacier Park painters Joseph Abbrescia (1936-2005); and John Fery (1859-1934). In the 1920's the Great Northern Railroad commissioned Fery to paint Glacier's "Alps of America."

Glacier National Park's Highway to the Sky is skillfully depicted in Going-to-the-Sun Road by C.W. Guthrie. Ms. Guthrie will be signing copies of her book during the opening reception for Rails, Trails and a Road. (Book also available in the Museum's Off the Wall Gift Gallery)


Contemporary paintings by nationally and regionally respected artists Mark Ogle, Nicholas Oberling, Monte Dolack, Bonnie Closson, Nancy Dunlop Cawdrey and Linda Tippetts are a significant part of Rails, Trails and a Road. Tippetts' 1993 painting of the Sun Road won the coveted Grand Prize in the Top 100 Arts for the Park's Contest. View this and three other Tippetts' paintings of the Sun Road in this exhibit.

Also highlighted in the exhibition: nationally recognized wildlife sculptor Sherry Salari Sander; local photographer Ed Gilliland; past Glacier Park Artist-in-Residence, Roy Hughes' whose Sun Road series in graphic design spans the entire road from St. Mary's to the West Entrance.



The Hockaday Museum's permanent collection continues to grow in size and quality. The New Year brought several generous gifts, most notably thirteen Ace Powell oil paintings from Pat McClarty. Donald Baughman donated Two Faces of Napi, a bronze by Ace Powell, edition #1. Baughman made his gift in memory of our late friend, Rex Breneman. Breneman was a friend of Powell's who sold the artist's work and published Ace Powell in Bronze. Rex and Iola Breneman were long-time friends of the Hockaday. Iola recently presented the Hockaday Museum with a portrait of Ace Powell painted by Belva R. Curtis. Iola's gift was also in loving memory of Rex. Since 1985, Miriam and Joseph Sample have been donating works by major Montana artists






